



GENERAL ASSEMBLY 2024

As you all know our minister, Shaw, has left us for a year to take up his role as Moderator of the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland. We are indebted to our Interim Moderator, Rev Norman McKee who will oversee the business of the church and who along with our Worship Leaders and Shaw's two Moderator chaplains, Rev Robbie Hamilton and Rev Robert Allan will ensure that worship will continue in all three of our church buildings.

His installation as Moderator will be on Saturday 18 May 2024 at the General Assembly which takes place at the Assembly Hall on the Mound, and he will preach in St Giles Cathedral on Sunday 19 May. There will be a joint service in Strathaven on that day when Rev Norman McKee will lead us in worship. The sermon will be a recording of Shaw preaching in St Giles.

Moderators Visit 2nd June 2024

Shaw has been given permission to return to lead us in worship on Sunday 2nd June. This will be a joint service in Strathaven at 11am. We are delighted that he will preach as Moderator. During the service he will present long service certificates to a number of Elders and there will be a presentation to him on behalf of the Strathaven Trinity congregation. Julie will be running a Godly Play session in the small hall for all children who would like to join her

Following the service there will be what Shaw calls a "Bun Feast" and we are grateful to The Guild who are organising this. As we anticipate a large attendance, we would appreciate donations of home baking. If you are able to help, we would ask that any donations are brought to the Hall on Saturday 1st June between 2pm and 4pm or at 10am on Sunday before the Service.

Lord High Commissioner

Prince Edward, the Duke of Edinburgh, has been appointed as the Lord High Commissioner to the 2024 General Assembly of the Church of Scotland, a decade after he last took on the role of royal representative at the annual gathering.

The Lord High Commissioner is the Sovereign's personal representative to the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland and is appointed by His Majesty The King to attend proceedings on his behalf.

The Duke, who was granted the title previously held by his father on his 59th birthday last year, will make the opening and closing addresses to the Assembly and carry out a number of official functions throughout the week.

CHURCH HYMNARY

The Church of Scotland is launching a new hymnary supplement called *God Welcomes All* during this year's General Assembly. The launch event will take place at St Cuthbert's Church in Edinburgh on Sunday May 19 from 7-9pm, and will feature special guests who have songs included in the collection. Tickets are free but expected to go quickly.

God Welcomes All is the first addition to the Church Hymnary since the fourth edition (CH4) was launched in 2005. It is a collection of over 200 hymns and songs in a wide range of styles by writers from Scotland and around the world. The majority have been written in the last 20 years, including songs by well-known writers such as John Bell, Getty Music, Phil Wickham, Fischy Music, Shirley Erena Murray, Sinach and Rend Collective.

With a focus on hospitality and welcome, the collection includes songs based on scripture, for different parts of worship, and the Church year, and covering contemporary themes such as creation and the climate crisis, lament, healing, pilgrimage, ageing and dementia, migration, and reconciliation.

We are also forming a choir to help lead singing on the night. There will be a rehearsal on the afternoon of the event and online rehearsals on the evenings of 1st and 14th May. Singers should be able to read music. We will be in touch with all those who sign up for the choir with further details.



STRATHAVEN CHORAL SOCIETY: HAYDN'S CREATION

On Saturday 27th April I spent a truly inspiring evening watching and listen-

ing to the performance of Haydn's Creation by Strathaven Choral Society along with the Bridge of Weir Choral Society, both choirs sharing Christopher Barr as Musical Director. The setting was Sherbrooke Mosspark Parish Church. Four members of our Trinity Parish were singing that night —



Barbara Smith, Christine Leitch, Linda and Bill Menzies – and I have to say I felt very proud to see and hear them be part of such an amazina evenina. I can only say that the whole performance completely bowled me over. I could have sat



there all night listening to the soaring voices and was quite disappointed when it came to an end. The soloists, Agostina Pombo, Seumas Begg and Colin Murray, were outstanding with notes so high you felt them floating way up to the roof and be-

yond. Margaret Gilmour from the parish was also in the audience and says 'It was out of this world – the whole performance was wonderful and the setting, with the high stained glass windows behind the choir, was just amazing and fitting'. I certainly couldn't agree more with that - it was the ideal setting for the Creation!

None of this happened by without considerable effort. Our own chorister, Christine Leitch told me that Christopher Barr 'trained them very hard and is quite the perfectionist'. They went over the music time and time and time again! What makes it all the more remarkable was that they only had one day of joint practice with the Bridge of Weir Choral Society. Christine said it was the most wonderful experience and fantastic to be singing with the orchestra – Strathgryffe Sinfonia. The Choral Society do 2 performances a year and I can't wait to hear what they will be tackling next Spring. Their other performance is the Christmas concert. I have mentioned in previous New Connections that I love that concert, this year to be held in the Scout and Guide Hall on December 8th. Tickets go fast - it is always a sellout and no wonder. It's always my favourite Advent outing!

'TITANIC: THE LAST HERO AND THE LAST COWARD'

On Friday I attended the play 'Titanic: The Last Hero and The Last Coward' performed by the Searchlight Theatre Group in the Epicentre, brought there by Strathaven Churches Together. The play tells the story of John Harper, a church minister, and Joseph Ismay an executive of the White Star Line who were both passengers on the Titanic; one deemed a hero, the other a coward on the night it sank. The **Rev. John Harper** gave up his place on a lifeboat so that others might be saved. His daughter and niece who were travelling with him survived.

The play alternates between interactions with the two men on board the Titanic and an enquiry in America where Joseph Ismay faces tough questions about the speed the ship was travelling at, the shortage of lifeboats and about the avoidance of iceberg warnings as well as the fact that he survived by taking a place on one of the lifeboats.

At times moving but also funny the play certainly highlights the heroic actions and demeanour of the Rev Harper and also the effect of his actions on the people around him including Joseph Ismay. The play was exceptionally well acted with only two actors - Michael Taylor as John Harper and Senator Smith; David Robinson as Joseph Ismay - in the whole performance. They were given a very well deserved round of applause and there were some interesting questions in the session which followed. Of local interest is the fact that Pastor Roddy Gillies' grandfather met the Rev Harper and was instrumental in bringing him to Paisley Road Baptist Church in Govan as their first pastor. The church was subsequently rebuilt and renamed Harper Memorial Baptist Church.

Searchlight Theatre Group, founded by Michael Taylor and David Robinson try to create theatre that can share life-changing stories with audiences, making them laugh and cry, experiencing what it is to be human as well as experiencing God. On this occasion they formed a partnership with Mercy Ships performing the Titanic play at the Edinburgh Fringe and on tour. A short video of the work of the Mercy Ships was shown before the performance.

Searchlight will be back at the Edinburgh Fringe this year, all shows at Palmerston Place Church.


EDITORIAL
