# In comparison to Christmas, how much does Easter cost?

There are Easter eggs, hot cross buns, simnel cake (and if you like marzipan, this is a must) together with a family

meal and day trips or holidays. In short, the two times of the year, the two major Christian festivals, cannot be compared in financial terms. When we think about it, Easter doesn't cost us much, and that is the whole point of Easter. Jesus gave his all, his life, that we might receive forgiveness and eternal life – and we receive these for free.

Easter is a truly wonderful season. It is the highlight of the church year but by the time you are reading this, it is past. However, I ask you to pause. Please don't leave Easter in the past. Let's ponder what Christ did for us on Good Friday by taking upon himself our sin, defeating death and opening up the gates to eternal life. Yes, it happened two thousand years ago but its not an ancient relic. Easter is just as real and significant and meaningful in 2024 as it was all those years ago. Easter will continue to be real, for Christ's death and resurrection is at the heart of our Christian faith. Therefore, we should celebrate Easter every day. While the trappings that surround this festival may soon be removed from the supermarket shelves, the message of Easter is always relevant.

As Christians we are called to take the message of Easter and share this free gift to all people. For God so loved the world...

After the resurrection, Jesus met the disciples and said:

"These are the very things I told you about while I was still with you: everything written about me in the Law of Moses, the writings of the prophets, and the Psalms had to come true."

45 Then he opened their minds to understand the Scriptures, 46 and said to them, "This is what is written: the Messiah must suffer and must rise from death three days later, 47 and in his name the message about repentance and the forgiveness of sins must be preached to all nations, beginning in Jerusalem. 48 You are witnesses of these things. (Luke 24: 44b-48)

Let's keep the Easter message at the forefront of our minds and share this wonderful, and free, good news throughout the year.







However, if you are having a function/party/event that generates more rubbish than usual please arrange to take it to the amenity site for disposal. Please do not stack the bin with the lid open or leave on the ground adjacent as birds and foxes make quite a mess.

## **CAR PARKING**

Please be considerate of our neighbours when parking for church events! Please ensure you park responsibly and be careful not to block anyone's access.

This applies for Sunday services, funerals, weddings and weekday activities in the halls.

At busy times parking is a premium and so please only use the car park off Crawford Street when attending the church or halls - there have been several instances lately when the car park has been full prior to anyone arriving for a church/hall event! Therefore, do not be afraid to ask if others who are parking in the car park are attending something in our premises and, if not, encourage them to park elsewhere.
